

The City of Park Rapids and Park Rapids Arts and Culture Advisory Commission celebrated the opening of this year's Sculpture Trail May 18.

Events started at Red Bridge Park and continued at the Giiwedinong Treaty Rights & Culture Museum to celebrate the installation of "Not Afraid to Look," a replica of a sculpture erected at the Sacred Stone Camp on the Missouri River during the Standing Rock resistance gathering.

"Not Afraid to Look" is one of 12 new sculptures installed this spring that will remain in place for a year.

This summer Chicago was the show suggested by many as a favorite. Set in 1920s Chicago and based on true crimes and criminals, the razzle and dazzle of the times will keep you entertained with songs such as "*All That Jazz*," "*Cell Block Tango*" and "*When You're Good to Mama.*"

The cast has been chosen and rehearsals will begin soon. Dates of the production at the Armory Arts and Events Center in Park Rapids will be July 26-Aug. 3.

NLOKids Drama Camp

2010 was the year of a special project of NLOC. NLOKids was introduced for kids of NLOC's cast and crew who often were present at NLOC's rehearsals. They created an original musical which they performed for families and friends.

In 2016, NLOKids was expanded and became a collaborative Drama Camp for kids ages 8-13 from the Pine community as well as Park Rapids.

Bus transportation and lunches are provided. Guided by professionals, kids write a story, create the music, make costumes, build sets and present an original musical for parents and friends at both the Pine Point Community Center and Park Rapids Armory.

2024's dates are June 17-July 13. Park Rapids Community Ed is a co-sponsor.

This program has been recognized by the Guthrie Theater and the Minneapolis Star Tribune.

WorkBench: New Play Workshop

In 2021, NLOC introduced another new project: WorkBench: New Play Workshop.

Led by professional play-writers from New York City, novice writers with stories to tell are inspired to create a 10-minute play. After meeting each other around a campfire, writers are given "prompts" to challenge their creativity, and then they regroup the next day for a week of intensive work, creating and tweaking their plays.

At week's end, their plays are performed by NLOC cast members before an audience. Audiences are impressed and writers are amazed and delighted and may be inspired to continue writing. This year's dates are June 9-15.

WorkBench: Filmmaker Intensive

In 2022, WorkBench: Filmmaker Intensive became a new NLOC project.

Led by a professional filmmaker from Los Angeles, aspiring filmmakers are challenged to create a story, then film, direct and edit the newly created work.

Cameras are provided. Folks around town might be intrigued if a camera person is spotted filming in some unusual spaces. These movies go from idea to reality to a viewing by an audience in just three days.

The workshop will be Aug. 6-10. The public is invited to the Filmmaker's Showcase at 7 p.m. Aug. 10 at the Armory.

Pottery Painting



Heartland Concert Association ... offers 5 concerts in 2024-25


As with most businesses and organizations, Heartland Concert Association (HCA) was no exception from needing to rebuild after the Covid pandemic. Three concert seasons were effected.
